

# Unsolicited Goods and Services Act 1971

#### **1971 CHAPTER 30**

## 6 Interpretation.

- (1) In this Act, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires,—
  "acquire" includes hire;
  - "send" includes deliver, and "sender" shall be construed accordingly;
  - "unsolicited" means, in relation to goods sent to any person, that they are sent without any prior request made by him or on his behalf.
- [F1(2) For the purposes of this Act, any invoice or similar document stating the amount of any payment shall be regarded as asserting a right to the payment unless it complies with the conditions set out in Part 2 of the Schedule to the Regulatory Reform (Unsolicited Goods and Services Act 1971) (Directory Entries and Demands for Payment) Order 2005.]
- [F2(3) Nothing in section 3 or 3B affects the rights of any consumer under the Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Charges) Regulations 2013.]
