THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 91/494/EEC of 26 June 1991 on animal health conditions governing intra-Community trade in and imports from third countries of fresh poultry meat ⁽¹⁾, as amended by Directive 1999/89/EC ⁽²⁾, and in particular Articles 11, 12 and 14 thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 92/118/EEC of 17 December 1992 laying down animal health and public health requirements governing trade in and imports into the Community of products not subject to the said requirements laid down in specific Community rules referred to in Annex A, Chapter I, to Directive 89/662/EEC and, as regards pathogens, to Directive 90/425/EEC ⁽³⁾, as last amended by Directive 97/79/EC ⁽⁴⁾, and in particular Article 10 thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 92/45/EEC of 16 June 1992 on public health and animal health problems relating to the killing of wild game and the placing on the market of wild game meat ⁽⁵⁾, as last amended by Directive 97/79/EC, and particular Article 16(2)(c) and (3) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Commission Decision 97/217/EC ⁽⁶⁾ as last amended by Decision 2000/161/EC ⁽⁷⁾, establishes groups of third countries which are able to utilise the veterinary certification for imports of wild game meat, farmed game meat and rabbit meat from third countries.
- (2) Commission Decision 97/218/EC ⁽⁸⁾ lays down animal and public health conditions and veterinary certification for imports of wild game meat (excluding meat of wild swine) from third countries.
- (3) Commission Decision 97/219/EC ⁽⁹⁾ as last amended by Decision 2000/162/EC ⁽¹⁰⁾ lays down animal and public health conditions

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and veterinary certification for imports of farmed game meat and rabbit meat from third countries.

- (4) Commission Decision 97/220/EC ⁽¹⁾ lays down animal and public health conditions and veterinary certification for imports of meat of wild swine from third countries.
- (5) In order to facilitate the consultation and the transparency of the European Union legislation and to update the animal and public health conditions and veterinary certification for import of wild and farmed game meat and rabbit meat from third countries, it is considered necessary to create a single decision; therefore, Commission Decisions 97/217/EC, 97/218/EC, 97/219/EC and 97/220/EC must be repealed.
- (6) Considering that a new certification regime must be implemented for the exporting countries concerned, a period of time should be provided for its implementation.
- (7) This Decision shall be reviewed in the light of developments in the animal health status of the territories of origin and, in particular, in the frame of the application of agreements between the Community and third countries concerning the matters covered by this Decision, notably as concerns Article 5 of the Agreement between the European Community and the Government of Canada on sanitary measures to protect public and animal health in respect of trade in live animals and animal products and Article 6 of the Agreement between the European Community and the United States of America on sanitary measures to protect public and animal health in trade in live animals and animal products.
- (8) The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing Veterinary Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

▼M13*Article 2*

Member States shall authorise imports of the following meat only:

- (a) meat of wild leporidae, defined as wild rabbits and hares, not containing offal, except for unskinned and uneviscerated *leporidae*;
- (b) meat of farmed rabbits;
- (c) meat of wild land mammals other than ungulates and leporidae, not containing offal.

Such meat imports may only come from third countries or parts thereof listed in Annex I and subject to the conditions laid down in the veterinary certificate following the relevant model in Annex III, in accordance with Annex II.

The exporting third country shall meet the specific requirements referred to in Annex II and set out in Annex IV and shall certify this by completing Section V of each health certificate following the model in Annex III.

▼M12*Article 2a*

Member States shall ensure that consignments of rabbit and game meat for human consumption introduced into the territory of the Community and which are destined for a third country either by transit immediately

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or after storage in accordance with Articles 12 (4) or 13 of Directive 97/78/EC, and not intended for importation into the EC shall comply with the following requirements:

- (a) they shall come from the territory of a third country or a part thereof listed in Annex I to this Decision for the import of fresh meat of that species.
- (b) they shall meet the specific animal health guarantees and conditions for the species concerned set out in Annex II and in the corresponding model animal health certificate drawn up under Annex III.
- (c) they shall be accompanied by an animal health certificate established in accordance with the model K laid down in Annex III, signed by an official veterinarian of the competent veterinary services of the third country concerned.
- (d) they are certified as acceptable for transit or storage (as appropriate) on the Common Veterinary Entry Document by the Official Veterinarian of the Border Inspection Post of introduction.

Article 2b

1. By way of derogation from Article 2a Member States shall authorise the transit by road or by rail through the Community, between designated Community border inspection posts listed in Annex to Decision 2001/881/EC, of consignments coming from and destined to Russia directly or via another third country provided that the following conditions are met:

- (a) the consignment shall be sealed with a serially numbered seal at the border inspection post of entry to the EC by the veterinary services of the competent authority;
- (b) the documents accompanying the consignment and referred to in Article 7 of Directive 97/78/EC shall be stamped 'ONLY FOR TRANSIT TO RUSSIA VIA THE EC' on each page by the official veterinarian of the competent authority responsible for the BIP;
- (c) the procedural requirements provided for in Article 11 of Directive 97/78/EC shall be complied with;
- (d) the consignment is certified as acceptable for transit on the Common Veterinary Entry Document by the Official Veterinarian of the Border Inspection Post of introduction.

2. unloading or storage, as defined in Article 12 (4) or Article 13 of Directive 97/78/EC, on EC territory of such consignments shall not be allowed.

3. regular audits shall be made by the competent authority to ensure that the number of consignments and the quantities of products leaving the EC territory matches the number and quantities entering.

▼B*Article 3*

This Decision shall come into effect 60 days after its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

Article 4

1. Commission Decisions 97/217/EC, 97/218/EC, 97/219/EC and 97/220/EC are repealed on the same date the present Decision will come into force, as mentioned in Article 3.

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2. Member States shall authorise the importation of fresh meat covered by the present Decision, produced and certified according to the requirements of Commission Decisions 97/217/EC, 97/218/EC, 97/219/EC and 97/220/EC during the 35 days following the date mentioned in Article 3.

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2. In the case of fresh meat or skinned and eviscerated wild *leporidae* the meat has undergone a post-mortem inspection at the wild game processing house in accordance with the requirements of Directive 92/45/EEC, has been passed as fit for human consumption, and an equivalent health mark as laid down in Directive 92/45/EEC has been applied to the meat and packaging ⁽⁴⁾.
3. In the case of unskinned and uneviscerated wild *leporidae* ⁽⁴⁾,
 - (a) the meat has been chilled to or below +4 °C for a maximum time of 15 days prior to the intended time of import, but has not been frozen or deep-frozen;
 - (b) an official veterinary health inspection on a representative sample of the carcasses has been carried out, and
 - no abnormalities were detected other than injuries associated with hunting and minor localised malformations and anomalies with no public health significance,
 - or
 - signs of disease or other abnormalities, as detailed in Annex I, Chapter V, to Council Directive 92/45/EEC, which rendered the carcasses unfit for human consumption were detected, as a result of which the remainder of the consignment has been inspected and all affected carcasses excluded from export;
 - (c) the meat has been identified by the fixation of an official mark of origin, the details of which are recorded in paragraph I above.
4. The meat has been produced in accordance with the provisions of Directive 92/45/EEC, Annex I, as they apply to meat of wild *leporidae*.
5. The transport vehicles or containers and loading conditions of this consignment meet the hygiene requirements laid down in Directive 92/45/EEC.

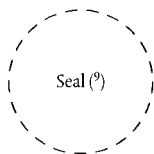

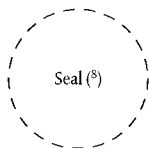



 - (a) animals which have remained in the territory described in Annex I to Commission Decision 2000/585/EC with code ... version No ... for at least six weeks before being slaughtered or since birth in the case of animals less than six weeks old;
 - (b) animals from farms or areas where during the last 40 days there have been no animal health restrictions for viral haemorrhagic disease, tularaemia and myxomatosis;
 - (c) batches of animals which were so identified that their holdings of origin could be traced;
 - (d) animals which, during transport to the approved slaughterhouse ⁽⁴⁾/approved game establishment ⁽⁴⁾ and whilst awaiting slaughter, did not come into contact with animals which do not comply with the conditions required for export of their meat to the Community.
2. The transport used to convey the animals was cleaned and disinfected before loading.
3. The animals come from a holding which receives regular veterinary inspections to diagnose diseases transmissible to humans or animals and random tests are carried out on meat derived from animals originating from the holding for the presence of residues in excess of permitted levels and these results have been collected and evaluated by the central service.
4. (a) The animals were accompanied on arrival at the approved slaughterhouse ⁽⁴⁾/game processing establishment ⁽⁴⁾ by a veterinary certificate issued by the veterinarian responsible for the holding of origin where the animals were slaughtered, stating that:
 - the animals passed a veterinary ante-mortem inspection in accordance with the requirements of Article 3 and Annex I, Chapter 1, to Council Directive 91/495/EEC on the holding(s) of origin within the 24 hours prior to loading,
 - and
 - passed an ante-mortem inspection at the approved slaughterhouse ⁽⁴⁾/approved game establishment ⁽⁴⁾ intended to detect injuries associated with transport;
