Plant Health (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1995

Made . 22nd December 1995 1st February 1996 Coming into operation

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections $2(\mathbf{a})$, $3(1)(\mathbf{b})$, $3A(\mathbf{c})$, $3B(1)(\mathbf{d})$ and $4(1)(\mathbf{e})$ of the Plant Health Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(f) and of all powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Plant Health (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1995 and shall come into operation on 1st February 1996.

Amendment of the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 1993

- 2. The Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 1993(g) shall be amended in accordance with the provisions of Articles 3 to 7.
- 3. In Schedule 1 (Pests prohibited) for Part B there shall be substituted the Part set out in Schedule 1.
 - 4. In Schedule 2 (Pests prohibited on certain plants or plant products) for Part B there shall be substituted the Part set out in Schedule 2.
 - 5. In Schedule 4 for Part B (Conditions to be met before plants, plant products and other objects may be introduced into or moved within certain protected zones) there shall be substituted the Part set out in Schedule 3.
 - 6. In Schedule 8 (Zones in the European Community recognised as "Protected Zones" in respect of the pests listed against their names) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in Schedule 4.

Plant Health EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further amends the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 1993 to implement as respects Northern Ireland—

- (a) Commission Directive 95/40/EC (O.J. No. L.182) amending Commission Directive 92/76/EEC (O.J. No. L.305, 21.10.92, p. 12) recognising protected zones exposed to particular plant health risks in the Community; and
- (b) Commission Directive 95/41/EC (O.J. No. L.182) amending certain Annexes to Council Directive 77/93/EEC (O.J. No. L.26, 31.1.77, p. 20) on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plants or plant products and against their spread within the Community.

The Order makes the following principal changes—

- (a) the protected zones into which certain insects, mites and nematodes may not be introduced and within which their spread is prohibited are amended in relation to Finland, Portugal and Sweden (Article 3 and Schedule 1);
- (b) the protected zones into which certain pests may not be introduced and within which their spread is prohibited if they are present on certain plants or plant products are amended in relation to France, Greece, Italy, the Isle of Man, Jersey and Portugal (Article 4 and Schedule 2);
- (c) the protected zones into which plants, plant products and other objects may be introduced or moved within (provided certain conditions are met) are amended in relation to France, Greece, Italy, the Isle of Man, Jersey and Portugal (Article 5 and Schedule 3); and
- (d) the zones in the European Community recognised as "protected zones" in respect of the pests listed against their names are amended in relation to France, Greece, Italy, the Isle of Man, Jersey and Portugal (Article 6 and Schedule 4).

The Order also revokes provisions of the Plant Health (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1995 (Article 8).
