The Legal Aid in Criminal Cases (Statement of Means) (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland) 2003

To be laid before Parliament

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 36(3) of the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a), and now vested in him(b), after consultation with the Lord Chief Justice, the Attorney General and the Magistrates' Courts Rules Committee and with the approval of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Rules:

Citation and commencement

1. These Rules may be cited as the Legal Aid in Criminal Cases (Statement of Means) (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland) 2003 and shall come into operation on 26th December 2003.

Interpretation

- **2.** In these Rules "the principal rules" means the Legal Aid in Criminal Cases (Statement of Means) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1999(c).
 - 3. After rule 2 of the principal rules there shall be inserted the following new rule –

"Interpretation

2A. In these Rules "diversionary youth conference" has the meaning given by Article 10A(2) of the Criminal Justice (Children) (Northern Ireland) Order 1998(**d**).".

Statement of means forms

4. For rule 3 of the principal rules there shall be substituted the following new rule –

"Statement of means forms

3. Form 1 in the Schedule shall be the prescribed form for the purposes of Article 32(1) of the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 (statement of means for the purposes of legal aid in criminal proceedings) and Form 2 shall be the prescribed form for the purposes of Article 28A of that Order (statement of means for the purposes of legal aid for diversionary youth conferences).".
