The Traffic Signs (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2009

The Department for Regional Development(\mathbf{a}) makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 28(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997(\mathbf{b}) and now vested in it(\mathbf{c}).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as The Traffic Signs (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2009 and shall come into operation on 30th September 2009.

Amendment

2. The Traffic Signs Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1997(**d**) shall be amended by inserting "(1300)" under "(1200)" in the list of numbers to the left of diagram 670 in Schedule 2.
