The Office of the First Minister and deputy First Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 5(1) and (2) of the Ombudsman (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(a) and Article 4(1) and (2) of the Commissioner for Complaints (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(b) and now vested in it(c) makes the following Order:

Title and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Salaries (Assembly Ombudsman and Commissioner for Complaints) Order (Northern Ireland) 2009 and shall have effect from 1st April 2009.

Revocation

2. The Salaries (Assembly Ombudsman and Commissioner for Complaints) Order (Northern Ireland) 2008(**d**) is revoked.

Increase in Salaries

3. The annual salaries payable to the Assembly Ombudsman and the Commissioner for Complaints shall be increased from £126,400 to £128,296 from 1st April 2009.
