EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM 2010 No. 40

The Horse Passports Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010

1. The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, after consultation with representatives of such interests as appear to it to be concerned, makes the above-named Regulations, which are subject to negative resolution.

2. Description

2.1 These Regulations enforce Commission Regulation (EC) No. 504/2008 in Northern Ireland. They provide for identification of horses, and replace the Horse Passports Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2004.

3. Matters of special interest to the Examiner of Statutory Rules

3.1 None.

4. Legislative Background

- 4.1 These Regulations enforce Commission Regulation (EC) No. 504/2008 in Northern Ireland. They provide for identification of horses, and replace the Horse Passports Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2004. Part 2 of the Regulations create offences for breach of provisions of the Commission Regulation.
- 4.2 Part 3 provides that the Regulations are enforced by The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development for Northern Ireland and gives powers to inspectors of that authority.
- 4.3 Breach of the Regulations is an offence punishable-
 - (a) On summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum or
 - (b) On conviction on indictment, to a fine.

5. Consultation

5.1 This amendment required consultation with the equine industry and other interested parties. A 12 week consultation was carried out commencing 5th December 2008. The majority of responses in general endorsed the proposed legislation, the only reservation being one area, namely that concerning making information on horse parentage

mandatory on the grounds that this data may not always be available.

5.2 In response to this DARD is proposing not to make the provision of horse parentage data mandatory at this time, but this may be reviewed in the future.

6. Territorial Extent and Application

6.1 This Statutory Rule applies to Northern Ireland.

7. European Convention on Human Rights

7.1 The proposed legislation has been screened for these issues and none were identified.

8. Equality Impact

8.1 These regulations will apply in equal measure to all Section 75 groups. It is not expected that any of these changes will impact differentially across any of the section 75 groups. There were no equality issues raised during the consultation on this legislation.

9. Regulatory Impact

9.1 A Regulatory Impact Assessment has been prepared for this instrument.

10. Financial Implications

10.1 There is already a high degree of compliance with these requirements within the equine industry. Consultation responses have shown there are no further financial implications.

11. Policy background

11.1 These Regulations enforce Commission Regulation (EC) No. 504/2008 in Northern Ireland. They provide for identification of horses, and replace the Horse Passports Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2004. Part 2 of the Regulations create offences for breach of provisions of the Commission Regulation. Part 3 provides that the Regulations are enforced by the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development for Northern Ireland and gives powers to inspectors of that authority. Breach of the Regulations is an offence punishable –

On summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum or

On conviction on indictment, to a fine.



Title of policy / decision to be screened:-

The Horse Passports (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2010.

Brief description of policy / decision to be screened:-

An EC Regulation has been passed, requiring all horses to be microchipped when applying for a passport after 1 July 2009. It has been a legal requirement that all horses have a passport since 2004, and a high proportion of horses in Northern Ireland are already being microchipped by the Passport Issuing Organisations here. DARD will be making legislation to avail of certain EC derogations offered in respect of this Regulation, as explained in the attached consultation document.

Aims and objectives of the policy / decision to be screened:-

The aim of the EC Regulation, and any national legislation drafted to implement it, is to protect the human food chain from horsemeat contaminated with veterinary products not suitable for human consumption.

On whom will the policy / decision impact:-

The legislation will impact on horseowners seeking a horsepassport after the 1st July 2009, although a large proportion of horseowners here are already complying with these requirements. Horses allready with passports before the 1st July 2009 will not be required to be retrospectively microchipped. Passport Issuing Organisations here will also be affected, as they will now need to ensure that passports are being issued to animals complying with the microchip requirement. Owners of exotic equine pets (such as Zebra) will also now need to obtain a passport for their animals, and see that they are microchipped if the animal is passported after the 1st July 2009.
