APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF ADVISORY COUNCIL.

1937. No. 54.

Whereas under Section 13 of the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland), 1926, as amended by Section 1 of the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, the Minister of Finance is empowered to appoint as members of the Ancient Monuments Advisory Council the curators of such museums in Northern Ireland as he may determine.

Now I, the Right Honourable John Miller Andrews, Minister of Finance, do hereby determine that, until this order is revoked, the curators for the time being of the following museums in Northern Ireland shall be members of the Ancient Monuments Advisory Council, namely, the Belfast Municipal Museum and the County Museum, Armagh.
