

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

These Regulations amend the Marketing of Potatoes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1964.

They increase the fee payable for the inspection of potatoes under the Marketing of Potatoes Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 from three shillings to four shillings per ton, and amend paragraph 7 of the Third Schedule.

## FACTORIES

**The Breathing Apparatus, Etc. (Report on Examination) Order  
(Northern Ireland) 1967**

ORDER, DATED 11TH AUGUST 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 31 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1965.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland in exercise of powers conferred by Section 31(6) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(a) and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Breathing Apparatus, Etc. (Report on Examination) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967 and shall come into operation on 4th September 1967.

(2) The Factories (Breathing Apparatus, Etc.—Report on Examination) Order (Northern Ireland) 1949(b) is hereby revoked.

2. Every report on an examination of any apparatus, belts or ropes made for the purpose of Section 31(6) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 (which requires the provision of breathing, reviving and rescue apparatus for the protection of persons working in confined spaces in which dangerous fumes are liable to be present) shall contain the following particulars:—

- (i) the name of the occupier of the factory;
- (ii) the address of the factory;
- (iii) in the case of breathing apparatus or reviving apparatus, particulars of the type of apparatus and of the distinguishing number or mark, together with a description sufficient to identify the apparatus, and the name of the maker;
- (iv) in the case of a belt or rope, the distinguishing number or mark and — a description sufficient to identify the belt or rope;
- (v) the date of the examination and by whom it was carried out;

- (vi) the condition of the apparatus, belt or rope, and particulars of any defect found at the examination;
- (vii) in the case of a compressed oxygen apparatus, a compressed air apparatus or a reviving apparatus, the pressure of oxygen or of air as the case may be in the supply cylinder.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order prescribes the particulars to be contained in the report on an examination of any apparatus, belts or ropes for the purposes of Section 31(6) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965, which requires the provision of breathing, reviving and rescue apparatus for the protection of persons working in confined spaces in which dangerous fumes are liable to be present. It replaces the Factories (Breathing Apparatus, Etc.—Report on Examination) Order (Northern Ireland) 1949, which contained similar provisions.

## WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

### Prescribed Stamp

REGULATIONS, DATED 16TH AUGUST 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1967.

The Ministry of Commerce, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 5(3) of the Weights and Measures Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

#### *Citation and Commencement*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Prescribed Stamp) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967 and shall come into operation on 25th October 1967.

#### *Prescribed Stamp*

2. The stamp prescribed for use by inspectors in the stamping of all weighing and measuring equipment which has been passed as fit for use for trade is a stamp in one of the following forms, as the case may be:—
