## The Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Amendment Regulations 2022

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 63(2) and (3) of the Planning (Scotland) Act  $2019(\mathbf{a})$ .

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Amendment Regulations 2022 and come into force on 30 March 2022.

# Amendment of the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Regulations 2021

**2.**—(1) The Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Regulations 2021(**b**) are amended in accordance with paragraphs (2) and (3).

(2) In regulation 3 (appointed day – pre-application consultation) for "1 April 2022" substitute "1 October 2022".

(3) In regulation 4 (transitional provision)—

- (a) in paragraph (1) for "1 April 2022" substitute "1 October 2022", and
- (b) in paragraph (2) for "1 April 2022" substitute "1 October 2022".

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

#### (This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Regulations 2021. The changes made by regulation 2(2) amend those Regulations to bring section 18(3) of the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 ("the Act") into force on 1 October 2022 rather than 1 April 2022. Regulation 2(3) makes consequential changes to the transitional provision contained in regulation 4 of those Regulations.
