

Derbyshire Mining Customs and Mineral Courts Act 1852

1852 CHAPTER clxiii 16 and 17 Vict

XIV Great Barmote Court for the Manor or Liberty of Litton.

It shall be lawful for the said*Nathaniel*Baron*Scarsdale*, his Heirs or Assigns, or the Person for the Time being entitled to the First Estate of Freehold in the Mineral Duties payable within the Manor of *Litton*, or the Husband, Guardian, or [F1 receiver for] such Person, if such Person be a Feme Covert, Infant, Idiot, [F2 person of unsound mind], or Person*non compos mentis*, to hold at his Discretion One or more Great Barmote Courts in every Year within the said Manor or Liberty, and the Periods for holding the same may be within a Month after the Twenty-fifth Day of *March*, and within a Month after the Twenty-ninth Day of *September*.
