# GEORGII III REGIS.

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### C A P. XCVIII.

An Act to unite and confolidate into One Fund, all the Public Revenues of Great Britain and Ireland; and to provide for the Application thereof to the General Service of the United Kingdom.

[Ift July 1816.]

HEREAS it hath become expedient, for further carrying into effect the Provisions and Purpoles of Two feveral Acts for the Union of Great Britain and Ireland (the One made in the Parliament of Great Britain in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, and the other made in the Parliament of Ireland in the Fortieth Year of His faid Majelty's Reign) that all the public Revenues of Great Britain and Ireland should be confolidated and applied to the Service of the United Kingdom; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affem-bled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the Fifth Confolidated Day of January One thousand eight hundred and feventeen, all Rates, Funds of Duties, Taxes, Receipts, Sums of Money, and Revenues, of what Nature Great Bri-tain and or Kind foever, which, under or by virtue of any Act or Acts in force Ireland, shall in Great Britain or Ireland respectively at the Time of the passing of this become One Act, and immediately before the faid Fifth Day of January One thousand General Con-eight hundred and seventeen, shall or may constitute or form part of, or be directed to be carried to the several Funds, called the Confolidated Fund. Fund of Great Britain and the Confolidated Fund of Ireland respectively, shall be carried to, and shall be and become, and shall form and constitute

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One General Fund, to be called the Confolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and that the faid Confolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, whether the fame or any Part thereof shall be in the Exchequer of Great Britain or in the Exchequer of Ireland, Ihall, in the First Place, be charged and chargeable with, and thall from Time to Time be applied indiferiminately to the Payment of the Whole of the Interest of the National Debts of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Sinking Funds applicable to the Reduction thereof, as One joint Confolidated National Debt, Intereft, and Sinking Fund; and in the next Place, the faid Confolidated Fund of the faid United Kingdom shall in like Manner be charged and chargeable with, and shall be applied to the Payment of the Salaries and other Charges of His Majefty's Civil Lift Eftablishments in Great Britain and Ireland ; and in the next Place, the faid Confolidated Fund of the faid United Kingdom shall be in like Manner charged and chargeable with, and shall be applied in Payment of all other Charges what foever, made payable out of the Confolidated Funds of Great Britain or Ireland respectively, under or by virtue of any Act or Acts in force immediately before the Iaid Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and after Payment and Satisfaction of all the aforefaid Charges, the faid Confolidated Fund of the United Kingdom shall be in like Manner indifcriminately applied to the Service of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or any Part thereof, as shall be directed by Parliament, and shall be issued and applied accordingly, in Manner and under the Authority herein-after mentioned and directed.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after the Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and feventeen, the Offices of Lord High Treasurer of Great Britain and Lord High Treasurer of Ireland shall be united into One Office, and the Perfon holding the fame shall be called Lord High Treasurer of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and that whenever there shall not be any fuch Lord High Treasurer, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, to appoint Commissioners for executing the Offices of Treasurer of the Exchequer of Great Britain and Lord High Treasurer of Ireland; and that fuch Commissioners shall be called Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that the faid Commissioners shall have all such Powers and Authorities in and through the Whole of the faid United Kingdom, with refpect to the Collection, Iffuing, and Application of the whole Revenues of the United Kingdom, as at the Time of the passing of this Act, and immediately before the faid Fifth Day of January One thoufand eight hundred and feventeen, are or fhall or may be vefted in the Commissioners of the Treasury in Great Britain or Ireland respectively, by anyAct or Acts of Parliament, or by any Law, Ulage, or Cultom in force in Great Britain or Ireland refpectively; by whatever Names or Defcriptions fuch Commiffioners of the Treafury shall or may have been at any Time known or described; fave and except in fo far as any fuch Powers or Authorities may Officers of the be altered or amended by this Act; and that all Officers and other Perfons Revenue fub- concerned or employed in the Collection or Management of the Revenues in and through every Part of the United Kingdom, shall be in all Respects fubject to the Orders and Controul of the faid Lord High Treasurer or the faid Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, of the United Kingdom of Great \*7

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Great Britain and Ireland; and thall be liable to all fuch Penalties and Punishments for Difobedience of fuch Orders, as they are or would be fubject or liable to, under and by virtue of any Acts, Laws, Ufages, or Cultoms, with respect to the Powers of the Commissioners of the Treafury, in force in Great Britain and Ireland respectively at the Time of the paffing of this Act and immediately before the faid Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and feventeen.

III. And be it further enacted, That (for the Purpoles of iffuing out of A Vice the Exchequer of Ireland all Sums which shall be paid into the fame, under or by virtue of the feveral Acts which now are or hereafter may be appointed. in force in *Ireland* for that Purpole, or which shall be paid into the same out of the General Revenue of the United Kingdom, under the Orders of the Commissioners of His Majefly's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,) it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, from Time to Time. by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Ireland, to appoint a Vice Treasurer for Ireland, with a yearly Salary not exceeding Two thousand Pounds British Sterling a Year, to be paid to fuch Perfon for the executing of the faid Office, payable out of the Revenue appropriated to His Majefty's Civil Lift Eftablifhment in Ireland.

V. VII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That all Warrants which fhall have been figned by the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Treasurer of Ireland, bearing Date on or before Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and which shall then remain in the Office of the Auditor General of the Exchequer, unfatisfied and unpaid, or partly unfatisfied or unpaid, fhall be good, full, and fufficient Authority to the faid Auditor General for the lifue of his Order to the Teller of the Exchequer for Payment, until the full Amount of fuch Warrants be fatisfied and paid; any Thing herein-before contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

VIII. And, in order that no Annual Grants of Parliament may be ex-Ireland to be ceeded, be it further enacted, That all Grants under the Great or Privy Seal or Sign Manual of His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, King's Let-\*5

And be it further enacted, That from and after the Fifth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and feventeen, no Money shall be iffued out of the Receipt of the Exchequer of *Ireland*, otherwife than by the Vice Treasurer for Ireland, under the Authority of the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, in Manner hereinafter mentioned; and that the faid Vice Treasurer shall not iffue, nor caufe to be iffued, out of the faid Receipt of the Exchequer of Ireland, any Sum or Sums of Money whatfoever (except as herein-after mentioned) until fuch Vice Treasurer shall have received a Warrant, under the Hand of fuch Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors, directed to the faid Vice Treasurer for that Purpose; and that the faid Vice Treasurer shall countersign all such Warrants of such Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland; and that after fuch Counter Signature upon fuch Warrant, fuch Warrant shall be entered and marked by any Officer or Perfon thereto authorized by the faid Vice Treasurer, and whereof Notice shall be given by the faid Vice Treasurer to the Auditor General of the faid Exchequer; and fuch Warrant, fo being duly entered and marked, shall be a fufficient Authority to the faid Auditor General of His Majefty's Exchequer of Ireland, for the Iffue by the faid Auditor General of his Order for Payment on the Teller of the Authority for faid Exchequer: Provided always, that there shall be a fufficient Authority for all fuch Payments under fome Grant from His Majelty, or fome of His Royal Predeceffors, or under some Act or Acts of Parliament in that Behalf, and not otherwife; and that all fuch Payments shall not exceed the Amount authorized under the respective Acts by virtue of which fuch Issues shall be made, or the annual Grants of Parliament, as the fame fhall be fpecified in the Appropriation Acts of each Sellion.

And be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Issues being made from the Exchequer in Ireland out of the growing Produce of the Confolidated Fund arifing from Time to Time in that Part of the United Kingdom, for the neceffary current Services thereof, according to the invariable Courfe and Practice which hath heretofore prevailed there; fuch Iffues, neverthelefs, to be made in the Form and Manner directed by this Act: **Provided always, That on or before the First Day of February in every** be made good Year, an Account shall be made up in the Exchequer of Ireland, of all Sums which shall have been iffued out of the growing Produce of the Confolidated Fund, arifing there during the refpective Quarterly Periods commencing and ending as aforefaid, for defraying the current Services of Ireland, fpecifying in fuch Account the Heads of Service for which fuch Iffues were made; which Account fhall be certified by the Auditor General of His Majefty's Exchequer there, and shall be forthwith transmitted by the Vice Treasurer to the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and fuch Lord High Treasurer, or Commissioners, or any Three or more of fuch Commissioners, as the Cafe may be, shall thereupon, by a Warrant under his or their Hand or Hands, order and direct that out of any of the Aids or Supplies of the Year remaining in the Exchequer in *Great Britain*, applicable to the Difcharge of fuch Sum or Sums respectively a Sum or Sums equal to fuch certified Amount of the lifues made out of the growing Produce of the Confolidated Fund, arifing in Ireland for defraying the current Services there, shall be carried and placed to the Account and Credit of the Confolidated Fund of the United Kingdom within fuch Quarter, and the fame shall thereupon be carried and placed to fuch Account and Credit by the Auditor of the Receipt of His Majefty's Exchequer in Great Britain, and by the Auditor General of His Majefty's Exchequer in Ireland.

XXV. 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XXVII. And whereas Doubts have arifen as to the Mode of difcharging Perfons being Public Accountants in Ireland, in respect of Money islued Money iffued to them out of the Treasury of Ireland or otherwise, whose Accounts have to them from been audited by the Commissioners of Public Accounts, or the Commisthe Treasury, fioners of Military Accounts in that Part of the United Kingdom, and it is proper and neceffary that Provision should be made for that Purpole; be it therefore enacted, That in all Cafes where the Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts in Ireland, or the Commissioners of Military Accounts in Ireland, fhall have audited and certified, or fhall hereafter audit and certify any Account whatfoever of any Public Accountant, and it shall fatisfactorily appear to the faid Commissioners respectively, upon fuch Examination and Proof as to them shall seem expedient, that such Accountant is even and guit with the Public on fuch Account, it shall and may be lawful for the faid Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, and for the faid Commissioners of Military Accounts, and they are hereby respectively authorized and required, under their Signature, to acquit and difcharge, and grant a Quietus to fuch Public Accountant; and fuch Acquittance, Difcharge, or Quietus, shall be good, valid, and effectual, to all Intents and Purpofes, and shall be taken and received by any Court of Law or Equity in the United Kingdom, in Bar of any Suit or Process against fuch Public Accountant who shall have received the fame for any Matter or Thing touching the Period of Account, with refpect to which fuch Acquittal, Difcharge, or Quietus shall have been granted.

Commissioners fhall notify the Nature and Form of the Documents to be produced for obtaining fuch Quietus.

XXVIII. And, in order that all Public Accountants shall be fully apprifed of and prepared with the neceffary Documents or Proofs to entitle them to demand and receive fuch Acquittal, Difcharge, or Quietus from the faid Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, or the faid Commissioners of Military Accounts respectively; be it enacted, That the faid Commiffioners (hall respectively, as soon after the passing of this Act as may be, determine upon the Nature and Form of the Documents and Proofs required to be produced to them respectively for the Purposes aforefaid; and that the faid Commiffioners shall, by public Advertisement under their Hands, to be inferted in the Dublin Gazette, in Three fucceeding Publications thereof, and in any other Manner which they shall think fit, notify and declare the Nature and Form of fuch Documents and Proofs to all Public Accountants under their respective Departments; and it shall not be lawful for the faid Commissioners to alter or change the Nature or Form of any fuch Documents or Proofs fo required, until the Expiration of Three Calendar Months after the Nature and Form of fuch new Documents and Proofs shall have been notified and declared by public Advertisement in the Dublin Gazette, and otherwife in Manner aforefaid.

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
