# C A P. XCIII.

### An Act to regulate the Cofts of Diftreffes levied for Payment of Small Rents. [10th July 1817.]

HEREAS divers Perfons acting as Brokers, and diftraining on the Goods and Chattels of others, or employed in the Course of fuch Diftreffes, have of late made exceffive Charges, to the great Oppreffion of poor Tenants and others; and it is expedient to check fuch Practices; be it therefore enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majefty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the paffing of this Act no Per- No Perfon fon whatfoever making any Diftrefs for Rent, where the Sum demanded making any Diftrefs for Rent, where the Sum demanded Diftrefs for Rent, where of fuch Rent, nor any Perfon whatfoever employed in any Manner in the Sum making fuch Diftrefs, or doing any Act whatfoever in the Courfe of fuch due shall Diftrefs, or for carrying the fame into Effect, fhall have, take, or receive not exceed out of the Produce of the Goods or Chattels diftrained upon and fold, other Charges or from the Tenant distrained on, or from the Landlord, or from any other than men-Perfon whatfoever, any other or more Cofts and Charges for and in tioned in the respect of such Distress, or any Matter or Thing done therein, than such Schedule as are fixed and fet forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed and appropriated to each Act which shall have been done in the Course of such Diftrefs; and no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall make any Charge nor to charge whatfoever for any Act, Matter, or Thing mentioned in the faid Schedule, for any Act unless fuch Act shall have been really done.

Party aggrieved by any fuch Practice may Peace.

Justice may adjudge Treble the Amount of the Monies unlawfully taken to be paid with Cofts, which may be levied by Diftrefs.

Juffices may neffes.

Penalty.

If Complaint unfounded, Justice may give Cofts to the Party complained againft.

II. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons whatsoever shall in any Manner levy, take, or receive from any Perfon or Perfons whatloever, of retain or take from the Produce of any Goods fold for the Practice may apply to a Payment of fuch Rent, any other or greater Cofts and Charges than are Justice of the mentioned and fet down in the faid Schedule, or make any Charge whatfoever for any Act, Matter, or Thing mentioned in the faid Schedule, and hot really done, it shall be lawful for the Party or Parties aggrieved by fuch Practices to apply to any One Juffice of the Peace for the County, City, Town, and acting for the Division where such Distress shall have been made, or in any Manner proceeded in, for the Redrefs of his, her, or their Grievance fo occafioned; whereupon fuch Juffice shall fummon the Perfon or Perfons complained of to appear before him at a reafonable Time to be fixed in fuch Summons; and fuch Juffice shall examine into the Matter of fuch Complaint by all legal Ways and Means, and alfo hear in like Manner the Defence of the Perfon or Perfons complained of; and if it shall appear to such Justice that the Person or Persons complained of shall have levied, taken, received, or had other and greater Costs and Charges than are mentioned or fixed in the Schedule hereunto annexed, or made any Charge for any Matter or Thing mentioned in the faid Schedule, fuch Act, Matter, or Thing not having been really done, fuch Justice shall order and adjudge Treble the Amount of the Monies fo unlawfully taken, to be paid by the Perfon or Perfons fo having acted to the Party or Parties who shall thus have preferred his, her, or their Complaint thereof, together with full Cofts; and in cafe of Non-payment of any Monies or Costs fo ordered and adjudged to be paid, fuch Justice shall forthwith iffue his Warrant to levy the fame by Diftrefs and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the Party or Parties ordered to pay luch Monies or Costs, rendering the Overplus (if any) to the Owner or Owners, after the Payment of the Charges of fuch Diftrefs and Sale; and in cafe no fufficient Diftress can be had, such Justice shall by Warrant under his Hand commit the Party or Parties to the Common Goal or Prifon within the Limits of the Jurifdiction of fuch Justice, there to remain until fuch Order or Judgment be fatisfied.

III. And be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That it shall be lawful fummon Wit- for fuch Justice, at the Request of the Party complaining or complained against, to summon all Persons as Witnesses, and to administer an Oath to them, touching the Matter of fuch Complaint or Defence against it; and if any Perfon or Perfons to fummoned thall not obey fuch Summons, without any reasonable or lawful Excuse, or refuse to be examined upon Oath, or if a Quaker upon folemn Affirmation, then every fuch Perfon fo offending shall forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, to be ordered, levied, and paid in fuch Manner and by fuch Means, and with fuch Power of Commitment, as is herein-before directed as to fuch Order and Judgment to be given between the Party or Parties in the original Complaint, excepting fo far as regards the Form of the Order, and hereinafter provided for.

> IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for such Justice, if he shall find that the Complaint of the Party or Parties aggrieved is not well founded, to order and adjudge Cofts not exceeding Twenty Shillings to be paid to the Party or Parties complained against, which Order shall be carried into Effect, and levied and paid in fuch Manner, and with like 8\* Power

Power of Commitment, as is herein-before directed as to the Order and Judgment founded on fuch original Complaint : Provided always, that No Judgment nothing herein contained shall empower such Justice to make any Order or to be given Judgment against the Landlord for whose Benefit any fuch Distress shall against any have been made, unlefs fuch Landlord shall have perforally levied fuch unlefs he per-Diftrefs: Provided always, that no Perfon or Perfons who shall be aggrieved fonally levies by any Diftrefs for Rent, or by any Proceedings had in the Courfe thereof, the Diftrefs. or by any Costs and Charges levied upon them in respect of the same, Parties not to shall be barred from any legal or other Suit or Remedy which he, she, or be barred of they might have had before the passing of this Act, excepting to far as other legal any Complaint to be preferred by virtue of this A& fhall have been deter. Remedies. mined by the Order and Judgment of the Justice before whom it shall have been heard and determined; and which Order and Judgment shall and may be given in Evidence, under the Plea of the General Iffue, in all Cafes where the Matter of fuch Complaint shall be made the Subject of any Action.

V. And be it further enacted, That fuch Orders and Judgments on fuch Signature of Complaints shall be made in the Form in the Schedule hereunto annexed, the Justice and may be proved before any Court by Proof of the Signature of the Proof of Juffice to fuch Order and Judgment; and fuch Orders as regard Perfons Judgment. who may have been fummoned as Witneffes shall be made in fuch Form as to fuch Juffice shall feem most fit and convenient.

VI.
