

CHAPTER 21.

An Act to make Rules for preventing Collisions in the A.D. 1897. Sea Channels leading to the River Mersey.

[15th July 1897.]

 $\mathbf{Q}\mathbf{E}$ it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and **D** with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Mersey Channels Act, 1897.

2. The powers conferred upon Her Majesty in Council by section Power to four hundred and twenty-one, sub-section (2), of the Merchant make rules Shipping Act, 1894, shall extend to and include the power to for Mersey Channels. make rules concerning lights and signals to be carried or the steps 57 & 58 Vict. for avoiding collision to be taken by vessels navigating the sea $c_{c.60}^{**}$, channels or approaches to the River Mersey between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such sea channels or approaches respectively are for the time being buoyed on both sides.

3. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of August Commenceone thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, from which date the Repeal of Mersey Collisions Act, 1874, shall be repealed.
