1977 CHAPTER 27

13 Defence to charge of bigamy.

It shall be a defence against a charge of [^{F1}committing an offence under section 24(A1) of the Marriage (Scotland) Act 1977 or section 100(1) of the Civil Partnership Act 2004] for the accused to prove that at no time within the period of seven years immediately preceding the date of the purported marriage [^{F2}or civil partnership] forming the substance of the charge had he any reason to believe that his spouse[^{F3}or civil partner] was alive.
