## 1977 CHAPTER 50

### PART I

#### AMENDMENT OF LAW FOR ENGLAND AND WALES AND NORTHERN IRELAND

##### *Explanatory provisions*

#### **14 Interpretation of Part I.**

In this Part of this Act—

“business” includes a profession and the activities of any government department or local or public authority;

“goods” has the same meaning as in [<sup>F1</sup>the Sale of Goods Act 1979];

“hire-purchase agreement” has the same meaning as in the <sup>M1</sup> Consumer Credit Act 1974;

“negligence” has the meaning given by section 1(1);

“notice” includes an announcement, whether or not in writing, and any other communication or pretended communication; and

“personal injury” includes any disease and any impairment of physical or mental condition.
