

# Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 

1982 CHAPTER 30

## Part VII

## BYELAWS

12 General provisions relating to byelaws.
(1) Notwithstanding anything in section 298 of the ${ }^{\text {M1 }}$ Public Health Act 1936 or section 253 of the ${ }^{\mathbf{M 2}}$ Public Health Act 1875 or any other enactment, a constable may take proceedings in respect of an offence against a byelaw made by a relevant local authority under any enactment without the consent of the Attorney General.
(2) In subsection (1) above "relevant local authority" means-
(a) a local authority, as defined in section 270 of the ${ }^{\text {M3 }}$ Local Government Act 1972; and
(b) any body that was the predecessor of a local authority as so defined.
(3) It is immaterial for the purposes of this section that a byelaw was made after the passing of this Act.
