Nature conservation in Great Britain

131 Nature conservation functions: preliminary.

- [F1(1) For the purpose of nature conservation and fostering the understanding of nature conservation, the Council shall have the functions conferred on them by this Part and Part 2 of the Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006.]
 - (2) It shall be the duty of [F2the Council] in discharging their nature conservation functions to take appropriate account of actual or possible ecological changes.
 - (3) [F2The Council] shall discharge their nature conservation functions on and after a day to be appointed by an order made by the Secretary of State.

 - (a) such of the functions previously discharged by the Nature Conservancy Council under the Acts amended by Schedule 9 to this Act as are assigned to them in accordance with the amendments effected by that Schedule;
 - (b) the establishment, maintenance and management of nature reserves (within the meaning of section 15 of the National Parks and Access to the MiCountryside Act 1949) in their area;
 - (c) the provision of advice for the Secretary of State or any other Minister on the development and implementation of policies for or affecting nature conservation in their area;

 - (a) to accept any gift or contribution made to them for the purposes of any of the functions conferred on them by subsection (1) above or section 134 below and, subject to the terms of the gift or contribution, to apply it to those purposes;
