231 Notice of convictions and judgments to [^{F1}CMA]

- (1) This section applies if—
 - (a) a person is convicted of an offence by or before a court in the United Kingdom, or
 - (b) a judgment is given against a person by a court in civil proceedings in the United Kingdom.
- (2) The court may make arrangements to bring the conviction or judgment to the attention of the [^{F2}CMA] if it appears to the court—
 - (a) having regard to the functions of the [^{F2}CMA] under this Part ^{F3}... that it is expedient for the conviction or judgment to be brought to the attention of the [^{F2}CMA], and
 - (b) without such arrangements the conviction or judgment may not be brought to the attention of the $[^{F2}CMA]$.
- (3) For the purposes of subsection (2) it is immaterial that the proceedings have been finally disposed of by the court.
- (4) Judgment includes an order or decree and references to the giving of the judgment must be construed accordingly.
