# 1907 CHAPTER 29 7 Edw 7

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to Patents for Inventions and the Registration of Designs and certain enactments relating to Trade Marks.

GENERAL

Patent Office, and Proceedings thereat

#### 62 Patent Office.

(1) The Treasury may continue to provide for the purposes of [F7the Patents Act 1977, the Registered Designs Act 1949 and the Trade Marks Act 1994], an office with all requisite buildings and conveniences, which shall be called, and is in this Act referred to as, the Patent Office.

#### 63 Officers and clerks.

- (1) There shall continue to be a comptroller-general of patents, designs, and trade marks, and [F11 the Secretary of State] may, subject to the approval of the [F12 Minister for the Civil Service], appoint the comptroller, and so many examiners and other officers and clerks, with such designations and duties as [F11 the Secretary of State] think fit, and may remove any of those officers and clerks.
- (2) The salaries of those officers and clerks shall be appointed by [F11 the Secretary of State], with the concurrence of the [F12 Minister for the Civil Service]....


