

# Magistrates' Courts (Appeals From Binding Over Orders) Act 1956

### 1956 CHAPTER 44 4 and 5 Eliz 2

## 1 Right of appeal to quarter sessions.

- (1) Where, under the Justices of the Peace Act 1361 M1, or otherwise, a person is ordered by a magistrates' court (as defined in [F1 the Magistrates' Courts Act 1980] to enter into a recognisance with or without sureties to keep the peace or to be of good behaviour, he may appeal to [F2 the Crown Court]
- (2) In the case of an appeal under this section—
  - (a) the other party to the proceedings which were the occasion of the making of the order shall be the respondent to the appeal;
- (3) Nothing in this section shall apply in relation to any order an appeal from which lies to [F2 the Crown Court] apart from the provisions of this section.
- (4) This section shall not apply to any order made before the expiration of a period of one month beginning with the date of the passing of this Act.
