1812 CHAPTER 161

XIX Map or Plan to be completed in Five Years.

And whereas by an Act made in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for the better Preservation of Timber in the New Forest in the County of Southampton, and for ascertaining the Boundaries of the said Forest, and of the Lands of the Cretan within the same, it was amongst other Things enacted, That the Commissioners thereby appointed should cause a Map or Plan to be made of the said Forest in Manner therein mentioned: And whereas the said Map has not hitherto been framed according to the Provisions of the said Act; and it is expedient that the same should be executed with as little Delay as possible, be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or any Three or more of them, to employ-Surveyors, or other proper Persons, in framing such Map or Plan; and they are hereby required to complete the same within Five Years from and after the passing of this Act.
