1849 CHAPTER 51 12 and 13 Vict

33 Accountant may require information from banks.

The accountant shall have power to require the officers of any [^{F1}institution such as is mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c) of section 5(1) of this Act]with which any factor ^{F2}. . . [^{F3}tutor or curator] shall have opened an account for the estate under his care, to exhibit all entries in the books of such [^{F1}institution] connected with such estate, and the officers of such [^{F1}institution]are hereby required to exhibit the same accordingly, and to allow the accountant to take such copies thereof as he may require.
