CHAPTER 97

INCLOSURE ACT 1854

- 1 Lands subject to be inclosed may be exchanged pending inclosure proceedings.
- 2 Undivided shares may be exchanged.
- 3 Land to include incorporeal hereditaments.
- 4 Lessee the “person interested” in certain cases.
- 5 Orders of exchange, partition and division may be made upon application of parties in possession under an agreement.
- 6 Extending time for application for conversion of land to be inclosed into a regulated pasture.
- 7 Extending time for enrolment of awards under Common Fields Act or Local Act.
- 8 Tenure of allotments in respect of rights.
- 9 Fencing and making roads dispensed with, in certain cases.
- 10 Apportionment of fee-farm rents, &c.
- 11 Order of apportionment. Order to determine boundaries.
- 12 Confirmation of Order.
- 13 Recovery of apportioned amounts.
- 14 Expenses attending apportionment.
- 15 Application of compensation for common rights paid under 8 & 9 Vict. c. 18.
- 16 Money to be paid into Bank of England.
- 17 Interests to be ascertained by commissioners.
- 18 As to the payment of costs of inclosure commissioners, and as to the residue of monies.
- 19 Compensation for limited interests to be paid to trustees.
- 20 As to sums payable in respect of lands not exceeding 20l.
- 21 Act deemed part of “The Acts for the Inclosure, etc. of Land.”
