**The Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment)
Regulations 1972**

The Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under section 12 of the Industrial Training Act 1964(a) and after consultation with the Council on Tribunals hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations 1972, and the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) Regulations 1965(b) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”), the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations 1967(c), the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations 1971(d), and these Regulations may be cited together as the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) Regulations 1965 to 1972.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st June 1972.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(e) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of the principal Regulations

3. For Regulation 3(2) of the principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following—

“(2) The President shall vacate his office at the end of the completed year of service in the course of which he attains the age of seventy-two years.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) Regulations 1965, as previously amended, by providing that the President of the Industrial Tribunals (Scotland) shall vacate his office at the end of the completed year of service in the course of which he attains the age of seventy-two years.
