## COMPOSITION AND LABELLING

**The Fruit Juices and Fruit Nectars (Scotland) Amendment  
Regulations 1977**

*Made* - - - - - 7th November 1977

*Laid before Parliament* 23rd November 1977

*Coming into Operation* 14th December 1977

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 4, 7, 26(3) and 56 of the Food and Drugs (Scotland) Act 1956(a) as amended by section 4(1) of, and paragraph 3(1) of Schedule 4 to, the European Communities Act 1972(b) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and after consultation with such organisations as appear to me to be representative of interests substantially affected by these regulations and after reference to the Scottish Food Hygiene Council under section 25 of the said Act (in so far as the regulations are made in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 7), I hereby make the following regulations:—

*Citation, commencement and interpretation*

**1.**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fruit Juices and Fruit Nectars (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1977, and shall come into operation on 14th December 1977.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

*Amendment*

**2.** The Fruit Juices and Fruit Nectars (Scotland) Regulations 1977(d) shall be amended by substituting for the definition of “concentrated fruit juice” in regulation 2(1) thereof the following definition:—

“‘concentrated fruit juice’ means fruit juice which has been obtained from fruit by mechanical or diffusion processes and concentrated by the removal of part of its water, but does not include dried fruit juice:”.
