(Amendment) Regulations 1981***Laid before Parliament in draft**Made - - - - 21st December 1981**Coming into Operation 1st January 1982*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State, being Ministers designated (a) for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 (b) in relation to the Common Agricultural Policy of the European Economic Community, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 2(2), and of all their other enabling powers, hereby make the following regulations, a draft of which has been laid before Parliament and has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament :—

Citation, extent and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Hill Livestock (Compensatory Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations 1981, shall apply throughout the United Kingdom, and shall come into operation on 1st January 1982.

Amendment of principal regulations

2. In paragraph (2) of regulation 3 of the Hill Livestock (Compensatory Allowances) Regulations 1979 (c) (which authorises the payment of compensatory allowances for cattle and sheep) for the reference to £42·50 there shall be substituted a reference to £44·50.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Hill Livestock (Compensatory Allowances) Regulations 1979 (as amended) by increasing the compensatory allowance payable for cattle, from £42.50 to £44.50 in respect of each eligible animal.

The overall limit on payment for each hectare of eligible land remains at 97 European Currency Units. This increase is within the maximum amount permitted by Council Directive 80/666/EEC (OJ No. L 180, 14.7.1980, p.34).
