CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Central and Strathclyde Regions (Croftamie) Boundaries Order 1982

Made---13th October 1982Laid before Parliament26th October 1982Coming into Operation1st April 1983

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 17(2) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973(a) to give effect to proposals made by the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland under sections 13 and 14(2) of the Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Central and Strathclyde Regions (Croftamie) Boundaries Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1983.

Application of regulations

2. The Local Government Area Changes (Scotland) Regulations 1977(b) shall apply for the purposes of this order to such extent as may be required to implement the area change effected by article 3 of this order.

Area change

3. That part of the Dumbarton District and the Strathclyde Region containing an area including the village of Croftamie described in the Schedule to this order and delineated and hatched on the map signed as relative to this order shall be transferred to the Stirling District and the Central Region.

SCHEDULE

Article 3

TRANSFERRED AREA

The area transferred by this order is bounded as follows:—

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Dumbarton District and Strathclyde Region at a point being the prolongation southeastward of the southwestern boundary of parcel No 9779 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 microfilm (A) NS 4484 date of publication 1967, lying southeast of the property known as Meikle Finnery; then northwestward to and along the southwestern boundary of said parcel to and northeastward along the eastern side of the unnamed road leading northeastward adjacent to the northwestern curtilage of Meikle Finnery; then northeastward along the said eastern side of the unnamed road to the northern side of the road leading from the property known as Mavie Mill to the A811 road (Old Military Road); then northwestward along the said northern side of the road to the eastern side of the road leading past the property known as Blackford to the A811 road (Old Military Road); then northeastward and northwestward along the said eastern side of the road to the northwestern boundary of parcel No 5473 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 microfilm (A) NS 4486 date of publication 1967; then northeastward along the said boundary and the northwestern boundaries of parcel Nos 7568 and 9964 and continuing northeastward along the centre of the track to Nannie's Burn; then southeastward, eastward, northeastward and northwestward along the centre of the said burn to and generally southeastward and southwestward along the eastern boundary of Dumbarton District and Strathclyde Region to the point of commencement.


EXPLANATORY NOTE
