**The County of Cambridgeshire (Electoral Arrangements)
Order 1984**

Made - - - - - 12th December 1984

Coming into operation in accordance with Article 2

Whereas in pursuance of section 51(1) of the Local Government Act 1972(a) the Local Government Boundary Commission for England on 12th December 1983 submitted proposals for the future electoral arrangements for the County of Cambridgeshire:

And whereas in giving effect to those proposals I have decided to make certain modifications:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by sections 51(2) and 67 of the said Act, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the County of Cambridgeshire (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1984.

2. This Order shall come into operation on 2nd May 1985 except that for the purpose of all proceedings preliminary or relating to an election to be held on or after that day this Order shall come into operation forthwith.

3.—(1) The existing electoral divisions of the County of Cambridgeshire shall be abolished and that county shall be divided into seventy-seven electoral divisions which shall bear the names set out in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, and each such electoral division, except those referred to in paragraph (2) below, shall comprise the existing areas specified opposite thereto in column 2 of that Schedule.

(2) Each electoral division named in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order which is in the District of South Cambridgeshire shall comprise the areas specified opposite thereto in column 2 of that Schedule which areas are the wards and parishes of that District as they will be constituted on 1st April 1985 when Article 4 of the South Cambridgeshire (Parishes) Order 1984(b) (which alters some of the existing areas) comes into full operation.

(3) The number of councillors to be elected for each electoral division constituted by this Order shall be one.

4. Where a boundary is described in the Schedule to this Order as running along a road, railway line, footway, waterway or other similar geographical feature, it shall be treated as running along the centre line thereof.

5. The ordinary elections of all councillors for the County of Cambridgeshire shall be held simultaneously on the ordinary day of election of county councillors in 1985 and every fourth year thereafter.

6. Each registration officer shall make such re-arrangement or alteration of the register of local government electors as may be necessary on account of the coming into operation of this Order.
