FOOD

The Food (Revision of Penalties and Mode of Trial) (Scotland) Regulations 1985

Made	2nd July 1985
Laid before Parliament	25th July 1985
Coming into Operation	1st September 1985

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 4, 7, 13 and 16(2) as read with sections 56(8)(e) and (8A) and 60(3) of the Food and Drugs (Scotland) Act 1956 (a) and section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 (b) and of all other powers enabling me on that behalf and as a Minister designated for the purposes of the said section 2(2) of the last-mentioned Act in relation to (c) the common agricultural policy of the European Economic Community, in relation to (d) the presentation and packaging of food intended for sale for human consumption and in relation to (e) the labelling of milk intended for sale for human consumption and after consultation in accordance with section 56(6) of the said Act of 1956 with such organisations as appear to me to be representative of interests substantially affected by these regulations, I hereby make the following regulations:—

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Food (Revision of Penalties and Mode of Trial) (Scotland) Regulations 1985 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1985.
- 2. In each of the instruments specified in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 to these regulations, there shall be substituted for the regulation specified in column 3 of that Schedule, the following regulation:—
 - "If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the foregoing provisions of these regulations he shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable—
 - (a) on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £2,000;
 - (b) on conviction on indictment to a fine or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both.".
- 3. In regulation 2(1) of each of the instruments specified in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 2 to these regulations the words "statutory maximum" and the definition following thereon shall be deleted.

4. In each of the instruments specified in columns 1 and 2 of Schedule 3 to these regulations, the regulation specified in column 3 shall be deleted and the regulation specified in column 4 of Schedule 3 shall be substituted.

Transitional Provision

5. Nothing in these regulations shall affect the mode of trial or the punishment for an offence committed before the date on which these regulations come into operation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

- 1. These regulations apply to Scotland only. They alter the maximum penalties for offences against certain other regulations relating to food. In some cases the mode of trial for offences against certain food regulations is also altered to make the offences triable either summarily or on indictment.
- 2. The regulations take account of changes made to the Food and Drugs (Scotland) Act 1956 by the Criminal Justice Act 1982, which abolished daily fines for offences against the regulations concerned. The regulations also remove the possibility of imprisonment on summary conviction for these offences. The maximum fine on summary conviction against the regulations concerned is however raised to £2,000.
- 3. Regulation 2 provides in relation to the offences created by the regulations specified in column 3 of Schedule 1 the maximum fine and term of imprisonment which may be imposed.
- 4. Regulation 3 brings the penalty provisions of the regulations specified in Schedule 2 into line with the other penalty provisions.
- 5. Regulation 4 provides, in relation to the offences stipulated in regulations referred to in Schedule 3 for a maximum fine of £2,000 on summary conviction and imprisonment on conviction on indictment for not more than one year.
- 6. The regulations come into force on 1st September 1985 but in accordance with regulation 5 there is a provision that in the case of an offence committed before that date the mode of trial and maximum penalty under the previous regulations will continue to apply.

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
