1. This Order may be cited as the Health and Medicines Act 1988 (Commencement No. 1) Order 1988.

 - (a) in section 79(1) of the National Health Service Act 1977(2), paragraph (d) and the word "or" immediately preceding it;
 - (b) in section 71(1) of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1978(3), paragraph (d) and the word"or" immediately preceding it.
