Movement of pigs from a farm for breeding, exhibition, artificial insemination or veterinary treatment—Form of declaration

The Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 1995 (Article 9)Declaration relating to movement of pigs from a farm for breeding, exhibition, artificial insemination or veterinary treatment

I,, hereby declare as follows:-1. (a) I am the owner (or the duly authorised agent for this purpose of the owner) of the pigs which are described below and which are to be moved as so described;

- - (i) been returned from an exhibition or show; or
 - (ii) been moved on for breeding purposes in accordance with a declaration issued under article 9 of the Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 1995 and in the form set out in Schedule 3 to that Order or returned home under the authority of such a declaration; or
 - (iii) been moved on from an artificial insemination centre; or

 - (v) been moved from premises known as, being premises in the same occupation as the premises of origin and in accordance with conditions set down in writing by a veterinary inspector; or
 - (vi) been returned from a place to which they had been moved for veterinary treatment;
- (c) to the best of my knowledge and belief the said pigs are not affected or suspected of being affected with a notifiable disease⁽¹⁾, and have not been in any way exposed to infection from any such disease;
- (d) no pigs on my farm have been fed or brought into contact with any waste food⁽²⁾ (including any waste food originating from my own household) during the three months immediately before the movement;
- (e) no waste food⁽²⁾ intended for feeding to livestock or poultry has been brought on to my premises for any purpose during the three months immediately before the movement;
- (f) no waste food⁽²⁾ has been kept on my premises for disposal as refuse otherwise than in covered refuse containers during the three months immediately before the movement.

2. I further declare that, on return to my premises, the pigs will be detained there and kept separate from all other pigs for a period of 20 days.

⁽¹⁾ Notifiable diseases of pigs are Foot-and-Mouth Disease, Swine Vesicular Disease, Swine Fever, Anthrax, Teschen Disease, African swine fever, Aujeszky's disease, rabies and vesicular stomatitis.

(2) Waste food means-

- (a) any meat, bones, blood, offal or other part of the carcase of any livestock or of any poultry, or products derived therefrom or hatchery waste or eggs or eggshell, or
- (b) any broken or waste foodstuffs (including table or kitchen refuse, scraps or waste) which contain or have been in contact with any meat, bones, blood, offal or with any other part of the carcase of any livestock or of any poultry,
- but does not include meal manufactured from protein originating from livestock or poultry.

[The following must appear on the back of the declaration]

Conditions

1. The person in charge of the pigs moved under this declaration must-

- (a) carry a copy of it throughout the movement and produce it on demand to a constable or an inspector and, if required by that person, give his name and address; and
- (b) deliver the copy to the person in charge of the premises to which the pigs have been moved (whose duty it is to retain it for a period of six months from the date he receives it and to produce it on demand of a constable or an inspector).

2. Where a road vehicle is used for the movement of pigs the following conditions apply in addition to the provisions of the Transit of Animals (Road and Rail) Order 1975 (S.I. 1975/1024 as amended) and the Welfare of Animals during Transport Order 1994 (S.I. 1994/3249)(a).

3. Where a road vehicle is used for the movement of pigs, there is no requirement to cleanse and disinfect the vehicle by reason only that the pigs carried in it have been unloaded at a collecting centre solely for the purposes of feeding and watering and then reloaded back onto that vehicle.

4. After a vehicle has been used for the movement of pigs, the user of the vehicle shall cause it to be cleansed and disinfected not later than 24 hours after the movement is completed.

5. Pigs must not be transferred from one vehicle to another during the course of any movement except where the transfer takes place in close proximity to the premises from which the pigs have been brought immediately before the transfer and the transfer is from the vehicle which brought the pigs from those premises.

6. Pigs whose movement is authorised or permitted under different provisions of the Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 1995 must not be transported in the same vehicle.

7. Pigs must not be transported in the same compartment of a vehicle with any other thing.

8. If during the 20-day period of detention the pigs are to be exhibited at a further show or exhibition, a declaration will be required for their movement.

9. A copy of this declaration must be sent to your Local Authority within 7 days.
