Part I

Introductory Provisions

Citation, commencement and extent

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Duration of Copyright and Rights in Performances Regulations 1995.
 - (2) These Regulations come into force on 1st January 1996.
 - (3) These Regulations extend to the whole of the United Kingdom.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations—

"EEA Agreement" means the Agreement on the European Economic Area signed at Oporto on 2nd May 1992 MI, as adjusted by the Protocol signed at Brussels on 17th March 1993 M2; and IFIGEA state" means a member State, Iceland, Liechtenstein or Norway.]

Implementation of Directive, &c.

- 3. These Regulations make provision for the purpose of implementing—
 - (a) the main provisions of Council Directive No. 93/98/EEC of 29th October 1993 M3 harmonizing the term of protection of copyright and certain related rights; and
 - (b) certain obligations of the United Kingdom created by or arising under the EEA Agreement so far as relevant to the implementation of that Directive.
