## HOUSING, SCOTLAND

The Housing (Scotland) Act 2001 (Accommodation for Asylum-Seekers) Order 2002

Made - - - - 16th September 2002

Laid before Parliament 17th September 2002

Coming into force - - 30th September 2002

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 104 and 112(1) of the Scotland Act 1998(1), hereby makes the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Housing (Scotland) Act 2001 (Accommodation for Asylum-Seekers) Order 2002 and shall come into force on 30th September 2002.

#### Interpretation

**2.** In this Order "Scottish secure tenancy" has the same meaning as in the Housing (Scotland) Act 2001(2).

#### Accommodation for asylum-seekers

- **3.**—(1) A tenancy shall not be a Scottish secure tenancy if it is granted in order to provide accommodation under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999(3) (support for asylum-seekers).
- (2) A tenancy mentioned in paragraph (1) becomes a Scottish secure tenancy if the landlord notifies the tenant that it is to be regarded as a Scottish secure tenancy.
