Classes of Harm

Class II

2. A Class II harm is such severe harm as is reasonably foreseeable as a result of the hazard in question, including—

- (a) cardio-respiratory disease;
- (b) asthma;
- (c) non-malignant respiratory diseases;
- (d) lead poisoning;
- (e) anaphylactic shock;
- (f) cryptosporidiosis;
- (g) legionnaires disease;
- (h) myocardial infarction;
- (i) mild stroke;
- (j) chronic confusion;
- (k) regular severe fever;
- (l) loss of a hand or foot;
- (m) serious fractures;
- (n) serious burns;
- (o) loss of consciousness for days.
