# OBJECTING TO THE DISCONTINUANCE OF PROCEEDINGS IN A MAGISTRATES' COURT

#### Form of notice

**8.2.** Notice under section 23(3), (4) or (7) of the Prosecution of Offences Act 1985(1) shall be given in writing and shall contain sufficient particulars to identify the particular offence to which it relates; and, without prejudice to any other lawful method of giving notice, may be given by post in a registered letter or by the recorded delivery service, in which case it shall be treated as having been given on the date on which it is received for dispatch by the postal operator (within the meaning of the Postal Services Act 2000(2)) concerned.
