The Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 (Commencement No. 3, Transitional and Saving Provisions and Commencement No. 2 (Amendment)) Order 2008

Citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 (Commencement No. 3, Transitional and Saving Provisions and Commencement No. 2 (Amendment)) Order 2008.
 - (2) In this Order—
 - "the Act" means the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007;
 - "the 1972 Act" means the Local Government Act 1972(1);
 - "the 1983 Act" means the Representation of the People Act 1983(2);
 - "the 1992 Act" means the Local Government Act 1992(3);
 - "the 1997 Act" means the Local Government and Rating Act 1997(4);
 - "council" means-
 - (a) a district council; or
 - (b) a county council in England for an area in which there are no district councils; and
 - "relevant date" means the day following the day on which this Order is made.

Commencement of Provisions

- **2.** The following provisions of the Act come into force on the day following the day on which this Order is made—
 - (a) section 75 (parishes: alternative styles);
 - (b) sections 79 to 102 (reorganisation);
 - (c) Schedule 5 (parishes: further amendments), except for paragraph 7; and
 - (d) subject to the transitional and saving provisions specified in the Schedule to this Order, section 241 (repeals) in so far as it relates to Part 2 of the 1997 Act(5).
