THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (GRADING AND MARKING) (CAERPHILLY CHEESE) REGULATIONS, 1939, DATED JANUARY 11, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRI-CULTURE AND FISHERIES AS TO GRADE DESIGNATIONS AND GRADE DESIGNATION MARKS FOR CAERPHILLY CHEESE.

1939 No. 63

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Agricultural Produce 18 & 19 Geo. (Grading and Marking) Acts, 1928 and 1931, the Minister of Agriculture 5. c. 19. and Fisheries hereby makes the following Regulations:—

21 & 22 Geo. 5. c. 40.

1. Grade designations to indicate the quality of Caerphilly cheese Prescription made from cows' milk produced in England and Wales shall be as of Grade follows :--

Designations.

EXTRA SELECTED STANDARD

and the quality indicated by such grade designations shall be deemed to be the quality as described in the First Schedule hereto.

AGRICULTURE

Prescription of Grade Designation Marks.

2. A grade designation mark shall be either of the grade designations specified in regulation 1 above associated with the words "Empire Buying Begins at Home," and with the following mark, namely, a map of England and Wales in silhouette with the words "Produce of England and Wales" inscribed in a circle placed centrally in the map within which circle is a design representing the Union Tack, and which is more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Construction tion.

3. In any certificate issued by the National Mark Committee under of certificates the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) (General) Regulations, of authorisa- 1928,(a) authorising the marking of Caerphilly cheese with the grade designation mark prescribed by the Regulations hereby revoked, references to the said Regulations shall be construed as references to these Regulations.

Date of coming into operation.

4. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 11th January, 1939.

Revocation.

5. The Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) (Caerphilly Cheese) Regulations, 1935,(b) shall be revoked as from the 25th January, 1939, but without prejudice to anything done thereunder before the date of revocation.

Short Title.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Grading and Marking) (Caerphilly Cheese) Regulations, 1939.
